1. Secretary's Report

Dave Reichle moved that we allow usage of stamps for the mailing the letters and applications for the next year. Chris Zarnosky seconded it. After a vote, it was unanimously approved.

Debi Hampton spoke with HCS regarding usage of Hilliard Crossing Elementary School for our meetings from January through May. There was a date or two that were not going to work out with our regularly scheduled meetings. We discussed some alternates and Debi will check them out.

Dave Reichle said that city is back on top of the resident that has the car parked in their yard. He will talk to a code representative next week to see about getting the car removed.

We discussed some of the abandoned properties in the neighborhood and their status.
