## CROSS CREEK BLOCK WATCH REPORT FOR CROSS CREEK VILLAGE CIVIC ASSOCIATION MEETING, Apr 4, 2013

### MARCH INCIDENTS (This is extremely abbreviated; I can expand on it more if needed at later point)

- Ongoing problems with house on Silver Bow; in process of follow up with Code Enforcement
- Vandalism on Goldfield (glass shards placed in driveway), Casper (egging on vehicle and rocks thrown at house), and Phoenix (egging of house)
- Criminal damaging on Granite
- Arrest of man made on Hillrose for outstanding warrants

### NEWSPAPER UPDATE

- Heard from the Circulation Manager of *The Columbus Dispatch*
- Sent a summary of street by street feedback
  - of 26 streets I got feedback about, only 4 were consistently reporting delivery of the weekly paper; 4 others were getting paper frequently but not every week; rest were sporadic/not at all
- Circulation manager and warehouse distribution manager (Georgesville Rd) drove all of Cross Creek and the Singleton condo area after the delivery on Mar 28<sup>th</sup>; 5-6 streets in CCV did not get any papers that day, but several streets did get papers for the first time in months
- Managers were not happy to see this and did not know this was happening (they will be working with the contract service to get this corrected)
- Sent more feedback to them in the past week

### PEDDLER'S LICENSES

- Working America
  - Political affiliate of the AFL/CIO
  - Looking for petition signatures (got reports of as late as 8:45 PM)
  - Ofc Paulus looked into this...political groups do not have to abide by the commercial licensing rules; I still need to determine if there are restrictions if they ask for money

### SUMMER SOCIAL INFORMATION

- Met with reps from other neighborhoods on Mar 19<sup>th</sup> at Police Academy
- Next meeting scheduled for Apr 9, 7-8 PM at Police Academy
- In process of working on getting Imagination Playground to come from Department of Health
- Talked with Mike Smith at Target (his last day here in Cols store is Apr 5<sup>th</sup>; we'll be working with store manager and his temp replacement until permanent position filled): they are definitely interested in working with us this year.
- Started working on money matters:
  - Silent Auction: \$675.00 - \$100.00 (change) = \$575.00 (there are several checks that I will need to follow up with the endorsers to let them know I'll be cashing them soon)
  - Raffle: \$153.00 - \$100.00 (change) = \$53.00
