Meeting Minutes

The meeting came to order at 6:37 p.m. The following members were present: Debi Hampton, Chris Zarnosky, Dave Reichle, Renee Mushalko and Victor Sergi

1. Secretary's Report

- a. The July 11th CCVCA Meeting Minutes were distributed and members were given the opportunity to review.
- b. Victor Sergi moved to accept the report with the approved amended bylaws added to the document and Renee Mushalko seconded.
- c. After a voice vote, the report was unanimously approved.

2. Treasurer's Report

- a. 4 renewal and 2 new memberships at the social in the amount of \$105. There is now a total of 53 households.
- b. There were donations made to the Block Watch at the Summer Social in the amount of \$33.
- c. Victor Sergi moved to accept the report as submitted and Dave Reichle seconded.
- d. After a voice vote, the report was unanimously approved.

3. Committee Reports

- a. Block Watch – Report was reviewed and vandalism issues were discussed as well as the community meeting. See attached report for details and additional items.
- b. Victor Sergi moved to accept the report Dave Reichle second.
- c. After a voice vote, the report was unanimously approved.

4. Main Business

Nominations for 2013-2014 Officers

Current nominations include: Debi Hampton for President, Dave Reichle for Vice President, Bob Sorley for Treasurer and Chris Zarnosky for Secretary.

Victor moved that we accept the aforementioned nominations and Renee Mushalko seconded. After a voice vote, the nominations were unanimously accepted.

Membership Drive - Renewals pay \$20 for the 2013-14 year with a \$5 reduction per quarter was discussed. Renee Mushalko proposed that we keep the membership at \$20 per year with a \$5 reduction per quarter like previous year, and offer an incentive for the summer social. The incentive was to offer Aug, Sept, Oct and Nov within the new year's membership of \$20 if they signed up at the Summer Social. Chris Zarnosky seconded the motion. After a voice vote, this was approved with one member abstaining.

Front Entrance Neighborhood Clean Up

Keep Columbus Beautiful invited us to participate in "Pick It Up!" We will be meeting on Saturday, September 7 at 10:00 a.m. to clean up the front entrance and trash along Walcutt Road. We hope to have enough people to be done by Noon.

Building Use

We were approved for building use without fees for the 2013-2014 school year. Kim Matthews was unaware of the "designation change" for our group in the letter from 2009 signed by Tim Hamilton. This status, determined in 2009, classifies our group as exempt from the building usage fees, aside from janitorial fees if we request non-regular hour usage.

The executive committee's next meeting to be determined.

Renee Mushalko moved that we adjourn at 7:31 p.m. and Victor Sergi seconded it. After a voice vote, the meeting was adjourned. The next meeting is set for Thursday, October 3rd at 7:00 p.m.

**CROSS CREEK BLOCK WATCH REPORT FOR
CROSS CREEK VILLAGE CIVIC ASSOCIATION MEETING, Sept 5, 2013**

JULY INCIDENTS

- Vandalism evolved to eggings and bricks thrown at some vehicles, and began spreading to other areas of the neighborhood; was quite extensive this month. More than 20 vehicles egged, a handful of vehicles bricked or stoned, several tagged, and over a dozen homes tagged. Elementary school was also tagged, as was the back of the shops at Tinapple Plaza.
- Taggings (graffiti, dWb symbol) began appearing around neighborhood
- Massive documentation given to police regarding the vandalism.
- Numerous complaints again about solicitors, primarily representatives from AT&T (very pushy); also heard complaint about Vivant and Kirby Vacuums

AUGUST INCIDENTS

- Vandalism and taggings continued into August
- Organized meeting with police departments to address issues with graffiti and gang activity
- Last week of August, several cars broken into and one stolen on Gillette
- Last week of August, reports of mail being taken from two mailboxes and an attempt from a third (all on far north end of the neighborhood), but the last incident was thwarted by observant neighbor taking action

SUMMER SOCIAL INFORMATION

- Extremely successful summer social
- All follow up had to be put on hold to address vandalism
- Have turned over pictures to Ofc Paulus and to Target's James Cooper; thank you written and delivered to Target
- Have added several new members to block watch; once social follow up is complete, we will work to ensure all are in a designated group with a captain
